

Minutes of Regular Meeting of
Reclamation District 828
Held on April 13, 2026

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 828 was held at 10:30 a.m. on April 13, 2026 at 3121 West March Lane, Suite 100, Stockton, California.

Item No. 1: Call to Order/Roll Call. The meeting was called to order at 10:30 a.m. Present were President Deby Provost, Trustee Paul Marsh, Andy Pinasco, District Counsel/Secretary, and Joe Prescott, District Engineer. Also present were Juan Nierra of the San Joaquin Area Flood Control Agency (SJAFC), and Vin Lee, Greg McClain, and Kyle Sherman of the Stockton Police Department (SPD), who attended as part of a strategic operations briefing regarding unhoused individuals. Introductions were made.

Item No. 2: Public Comment. There was no public comment.

Item No. 3: Minutes. The minutes of the District's special meeting of January 16, 2026, were approved unanimously by the Trustees present on a motion by Trustee Paul Marsh, seconded by President Deby Provost.

Item No. 4: Financial Report. Mr. Pinasco presented the District's Financial Report and reviewed it with the Trustees. After discussion, the Financial Report was accepted and approved unanimously by the Trustees present on a motion by Trustee Paul Marsh, seconded by President Deby Provost. The Board also discussed and directed that the employee fund be moved to the County.

Item No. 5: Oath of Office. Trustee Miguel Villapudua was not present.

Item No. 6: Election of Officers. The Board conducted its annual election of officers. After discussion, the following officers were unanimously elected on a motion by President Deby Provost, seconded by Trustee Paul Marsh:

- (a) President: Deby Provost
- (b) Vice-President: Paul Marsh
- (c) Secretary: Andy Pinasco

Item No. 7: Engineer's Report. Mr. Prescott provided a written and oral report on the following:

I. AB 360 DELTA LEVEE SUBVENTIONS PROGRAM

A. Mr. Prescott reported that the Levee Maintenance Project for Fiscal Year 2025/2026 is complete. He noted that the project did a great deal to improve the condition of the district's

levees. General photos taken April 10, 2026 were presented as Exhibit A. Juan Nierra of SJAFCA attended and participated in a discussion regarding erosion of the levee caused by homeless encampments and angler use, including a broken storm drain outlet that is flush with the levee. Mr. Prescott indicated that the area would be considered for riprap reinforcement to address the erosion.

B. Mr. Prescott reported that no additional levee maintenance work is anticipated for Fiscal Year 2025/2026 beyond continuing vegetation control. He reported that planning for Fiscal Year 2026/2027 would include Rock Slope Protection work previously identified in the FY 2025/2026 plans but not completed due to budget constraints, including one area on Shimizu near the west end near Pixey Woods (including storm drain extension) and approximately six additional repair sites along the levee. Mr. Prescott indicated that a contract under \$25,000 should be sufficient to address the erosion repairs.

After discussion, the Trustees present unanimously authorized KSN to develop a project under \$25,000 for Fiscal Year 2026/2027 and to maintain vegetation control spray contracts with ChemWeed, on a motion by Trustee Paul Marsh, seconded by President Deby Provost.

C. Mr. Prescott reported that ChemWeed is contracted to continue maintenance vegetation control on the levees. President Provost reported that the vegetation control contractor is a new provider and expressed concern regarding the sequence in which the work was performed, noting that vegetation was sprayed and then cut within a few days thereafter. President Provost indicated she would report her concerns regarding the sequencing to Dave Carr or Chris Neudeck of KSN, the District Engineer. The ChemWeed proposal dated November 11, 2025 was presented as Exhibit B.

D. Officers of the Stockton Police Department (SPD) attended and reported on homeless encampments on District levees. Contact information was provided to Trustee Provost. SPD also provided information regarding the AskStockton application, which the City uses to generate work orders for law enforcement issues on the District's levees.

Item No. 8: Correspondence. Mr. Pinasco reported that the RD 1614 Town Hall meeting will be held on May 4, 2026. There was no other correspondence to review.

Item No. 9: Meetings Attended. President Provost reported that she obtained a spray license from the County.

Item No. 10: Trustee Reports. The Trustees reported that the levee is looking good following the work performed under the FY 2025/2026 maintenance project.

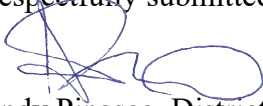
Item No. 11: Future Agenda Items. There were no future agenda items to add at this time.
